

DAVID WROE is Music Director of the Westfield Symphony Orchestra in New Jersey and Teatro Grattacielo of NY City, a regular conductor at New York City Opera and Principal Conductor at New York University. He was previously Assistant Conductor of the Boston Symphony Orchestra, Music Director of Kansas City Camerata and Principal Guest Conductor at the City Opera of Heidelberg, Germany. He is resident conductor with New York University Symphony Orchestra and was director of Orchestras at Montclair State University

Recent debuts and returns include engagements with L'Orchestre Nationale de Lille, L'Orchestre de Basse-Normandie, L'Orchestra Lamoureux, Royal Scottish National Orchestra, Taipei Symphony Orchestra, Taiwan National Symphony, L'Ensemble de Paris, Vorarlberg Symphony, Symphony Nova Scotia, Harrisburg Symphony Orchestra and Santa Fe Symphony.

He has taught and given master-classes at New England Conservatory and served as judge for the Music Assistance Fund administered by the American Symphony Orchestra League. Recording and broadcast credits include an all-Gershwin recording with L'Orchestre National de Lille and national broadcasts on Österreichischer Rundfunk.

Wroe's awards include the Seiji Ozawa Fellowship at Tanglewood and recognition in United States Congress for his excellence in contributing to the community in Kansas City. He was a finalist in the first Bernstein International Conducting Competition. He attended Lancing College and received a bachelor's degree from Manchester University and a master's degree from Northwestern University.
