Florence Price Piano Concerto in One Movement (~20 minutes)	9 4	 Opening: Bold piano and orchestra theme, bright and energetic. 2:00: Orchestra swells suddenly with brass and percussion. 10:00: Piano leads into a calm, lyrical section. 15:00: Music builds back into a triumphant, loud conclusion.
George Gershwin Rhapsody in Blue (~17 minutes)		 Opening: Clarinet slides suddenly from low to very high 1:00: Full orchestra bursts in with loud brass and percussion 2:00: Piano solo enters softly with flowing, dreamy lines 4:00: Full orchestra bursts through the serenity with loud brass in the lead 6:00: Whimsical and playful piano solo takes the lead 10:00: Sudden jazzy brass punches interrupt with loud accents 14:00-end: Fast, energetic build to a loud, brilliant ending
Carlos Simon Zodiac (~20 minutes)		 Opening: Full orchestra enters powerfully with percussion hits 8:30: Orchestra builds to an intense, powerful finish 9:00: Strings lead a swelling rise in volume 15:00: Music softens with floating textures and gentle rhythms 20:00-end: Bold low strings and brass swell, then fade to a soft finish
Aaron Copland Suite from Billy the Kid (~25 minutes)		 Opening: Quiet, spacious woodwind + string writing 3:00: Playful cowboy tunes, light and rhythmic 13:00: Very loud percussion crashes and brass 17:00: Calms into gentle, nostalgic music 18:00: Bold low brass and sudden percussion 20:00-end: Quiet fade with soft strings
