New Jersey Symphony Orchestra presents 'A Take 6 Holiday with the NJSO'



10-time Grammy Award-winning vocal sextet brings fusion of R&B, gospel and pop to program of Christmas favorites Orchestra premieres #ChoraleYou: Audience members can join 'Gospel Hallelujah' sing-in session after Dec 13 performance NJSO Accents also include pre-concert caroling in New Brunswick and Prelude performance by Newark Boys Chorus in Newark State Theatre co-presents New Brunswick performance

NEWARK, NJ (October 30, 2014)—Take 6 joins the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra for "A Take 6 Holiday with the NJSO" December 13–14 in Newark and New Brunswick. The NJSO POPS series opener will feature the 10-time Grammy Awardwinning vocal sextet, who will bring their patented fusion of R&B, gospel and pop on a program of Christmas favorites including "Joy to the World" and "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing." Joseph Joubert conducts.

Performances take place on Saturday, December 13, at 8 pm at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center (NJPAC) in Newark and Sunday, December 14, at 3 pm at the State Theatre in New Brunswick. The December 14 performance is presented in collaboration with the State Theatre.

The New York Times has praised Take 6's "creamy vocal blends and gleaming gospel harmonies." Of the sextet's celebrated Christmas performances, Smooth Jazz Ride writes: "Take 6, one of the most competent and most recognizable groups to ever successfully compete with any instrument we could possibly associate with the contemporary jazz genre, adds this sparkling touch to the season and gives us reason to close our eyes for a gleeful moment and realize that there is much for which to be joyful."

The NJSO invites audiences and members of the NJSO to sing the "Gospel Hallelujah" at the first-ever #ChoraleYou—a massive "sing-in" in the lobby following the December 13 concert at NJPAC. Donald Morris, music director of the Newark Boys Chorus, will conduct a brief rehearsal and performance. Concert attendees can watch the session unfold from one of the lobby's many vantage points and can share their photos and comments on social media using the #ChoraleYou hashtag.

An NJSO Accent event, #ChoraleYou is inspired by the excitement of last season's #OrchestraYou, which garnered national attention on NPR's "All Things Considered." NJSO Accents also include special festivities preceding each concert. In a prelude performance, the Newark Boys Chorus will sing holiday favorites in the NJPAC lobby on December 13; audiences can join in a sing-along of Christmas carols at the State Theatre on December 14.

THE ARTISTS

Take 6

Take 6 is the most-awarded a cappella group in history, with 10 Grammy Awards, 10 Dove Awards (Gospel Music Awards), induction into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame, Best Jazz Vocal Group honors for seven consecutive years in *Downbeat*'s prestigious Readers and Critics Polls, a Soul Train Music Award, BRE (Black Radio Exclusive) Vocal Group of the Year and two NAACP Image Award nominations, amid countless other musical and humanitarian citations.

Showing the global appeal of this phenomenal group, Take 6 celebrated its 25th anniversary with a world tour of Asia, South America, Eastern and Western Europe and the United States. Take 6 has reached new markets, including its debut tours of Australia and Canada, to rave reviews and overwhelming audience reception.

From New York's famed Blue Note to the Montreux Jazz Festival, from PBS to ABC TV specials, Take 6's 25th year has been a smashing success. It remains the quintessential and pre-eminent a cappella group in the world.

Joseph Joubert, conductor

Joseph Joubert has served as the conductor of *Motown The Musical* on Broadway and keyboardist/assistant conductor for *Billy Elliot*. His accomplishments are wide ranging and his talent has taken him not only across the continent, but also throughout the world. He has performed with the Bronx Arts Ensemble, New Philharmonia and the Manhattan, West Palm Beach, Mobile, Marin, Lancaster and Colonial symphonies. Joubert has appeared in New York City's major concert halls, including Carnegie Hall, Avery Fisher Hall and Alice Tully Hall.

For two seasons, he served as staff pianist for the Metropolitan Opera revival of *Porgy and Bess*. Abroad, he has performed in the International Festival of Two Worlds in Spoleto, Italy, and in Nice, France. Joubert has performed at the Pushkin Museum of Fine Arts in Moscow, Russia, and was the pianist/associate conductor for the Broadway show *The Color Purple*. He was an orchestrator for the film *Nights in Rodanthe*. He also has a solo piano CD, "Total Praise: Classic Hymns for Piano."

In addition to its lauded artistic programming, the NJSO presents a suite of education and community engagement programs that promote meaningful, lifelong engagement with live music. Programs include school-time Concerts for Young People performances and multiple offerings—including the three-ensemble NJSO Youth Orchestras and El Sistema-inspired NJSO CHAMPS (Character, Achievement and Music Project)—that provide and promote in-school instrumental instruction as part of the NJSO Academy. The NJSO's REACH (Resources for Education and Community Harmony) chamber music program annually brings original programs—designed and performed by NJSO musicians—to a variety of settings, reaching as many as 17,000 people in nearly all of New Jersey's 21 counties.
