In January, musicians served more than **4,000** community members of all ages, through **15** events across **7** New Jersey counties.



### Kean-CAU Concert

On January 9, Brennan Sweet, Naomi Youngstein, Brett Deubner, and Jonathan Spitz performed “By Chance” with Community Access Unlimited’s Academy of Continuing Education (ACE), a work arranged and conducted by New Jersey Symphony Youth Orchestra alumnus Owen Davitt. This annual concert unites ACE participants, Kean music education majors, faculty, alumni, and K-12 partners to share original music in support of equity. We were honored to join Kean’s Music Department, whose ongoing support of our Relaxed Performances helps make music welcoming to patrons of all abilities.

### East Brunswick High School

The visit concluded with sectional rehearsals, during which the musicians provided coaching and individualized guidance for the students.
